Community Assistance Helps Teddy Heal

Teddy was the 'sweetest kitten ever,' who loved to snuggle with his family, says his adopter Annaliese. But over time, he began to urinate around the house.

Annaliese tried replacing his litter box with a bigger box, and even removed the carpet in her daughters' bedroom, hoping that would solve the problem. Instead, Teddy started urinating on random rugs throughout the home. Annaliese suspected a urinary tract infection. She took him to the vet, who diagnosed the beloved cat with Legg-Calve-Perthes disease (LCPD) in both hips.

Legg-Calve-Perthes disease involves a decreased blood flow to the femur(s), causing degeneration to the femur's head and affecting function and comfort. Without surgery, Teddy would be in frequent pain and his quality of life would diminish to the

point that he would need to be euthanized. LCPD can be treated with surgery, but the cost of the surgery was more than Annaliese could afford.

Annaliese was familiar with DAWG as she adopted Teddy through DAWG's Found Cat program. She reached out to DAWG's Community Assistance program, which helps lower income, veterans and active military duty Douglas County residents keep their pets healthy by assisting with the cost of veterinary and other care.

Community Assistance agreed to help with the cost of the surgery.

The surgery was a success. Teddy is back to using his hind legs to jump onto the family couch for some snuggling. Best of all, says Annaliese, he is pain free!

Mama Cat and Her Kittens Get a Second Chance at Happy Lives

Diana was found near a golf course, very sneezy, very congested, very skinny, and very pregnant. She was also very friendly, jumping into her rescuer's lap while enjoying the sunshine on the porch. Nobody in the neighborhood recognized her, so DAWG took her into its Found Cat Program after verifying she had no microchip, and no one had called the shelter looking for her.



The next day she miscarried one stillborn kitten. Three days later she delivered four healthy babies. Her reserves were so low that she fell asleep between kitten 3 and kitten 4. Human intervention was needed to tie off the fourth kitten's umbilical cord. Diana woke up enough to clean up the kitten and get her nursing.

A few days later, Diana spiked a high fever and was diagnosed with a severe upper respiratory infection. She took her 10 days' antibiotics like a champ, and never stopped being a wonderful mama to her children. She even taught them to use the litter box - when one kitten started to squat in the middle of the bathroom floor, Diana promptly picked her up and dropped her into the litter box. Thanks for your help, mama!

Eight weeks after coming into foster care, Diana met her people. Now this beautiful girl is living her best life in her forever home. She even got to take her son William with her!

A year ago, a new cat showed up at a feral cat colony where our DAWG TNR (Trap/Neuter/Return) volunteer trappers, Donna and her husband Ed, set out food. They noticed the new kitty was older than the other cats, was starving and very scared. The existing colony of cats did not accept him.

Donna and Ed began feeding him separately. They were unsuccessful at trapping him, so during the winter days, Donna and Ed continued to go out between 3 and 4 each morning and shoveled snow to clear areas to place food for him.

Recently, Donna and Ed used a Drop Trap instead of a regular trap and they caught him. Tracee, another DAWG volunteer, was able to transport the cat to AMS for his neuter surgery that morning.

Shortly after he was dropped off, I got a call saying the cat was a neutered, microchipped male named Toby. We were able to contact his owners and began arrangements for a reunion.

What a story! In January 2022, Toby got out of his Cheshire neighborhood, crossed Highway 395 and made refuge where Donna found him. His dad searched for him for months and presumed he had passed. Can you imagine the joy in learning your beloved cat is alive?

A few days later, we were able to reunite Toby with his dad. Toby is over 9 years old and is a complete love. He recognized his dad and purred up a storm. Toby is happy to be back at home with his dad at their new location in Sacramento. And Toby is content to remain an indoor-only kitty for the rest of his life!

Walk this Way! Dog Volunteers Needed at County Shelter

Dog walkers make a huge difference in the physical and mental well-being of the canines residing at the Douglas County Animal Shelter.

The shelter can be a noisy and stressful place for dogs. Interaction with caring volunteers can help overcome that stress, as the dogs get essential quality time with people who care about them.

But as the number of homeless animals rises, there aren't enough volunteers to ensure that these pups get the outdoor time and affection they deserve.

Dog volunteers work one-on-one with adoptable dogs, taking them for walks and letting them romp in the fenced play yard at the shelter. And as a side benefit, dog walkers get valuable exercise themselves!

If you like dogs and can dedicate at least one 2-hour shift a week at the shelter, consider becoming volunteer Dog Walker. Experienced volunteers will partner with new walkers to help them learn the ropes of caring for shelter canines.
