# Thank you to everyone who answered the Holiday Appeal benefiting DAWG's Shelter Medical program.

DAWG pays for the majority of medical needs of animals awaiting adoption at the Douglas County animal shelter with the dual goal of making them comfortable as well as adoptable. Sometimes those expenses are extensive (remember the 9-month-old Malinois Ophelia who needed heart surgery in 2022?); other times, all the animal needs is a special diet to fix what's ailing him or her.

Here are some of the animals we have been able to help because of our generous supporters.

Moses, a 12-year-old cat, came to the shelter after his person passed away and was depressed. Shelter staff realized the handsome gray cat needed dental work. Once the problem teeth were extracted, he began to perk up. Happily, he was adopted by one of the cat care volunteers, who vows to make Moses' golden years the best they can be.



Sampson, a 4-year-old Argentino mix, was a sweet big boy who thrived on human interaction, but whose itchy skin frequently bothered him. DAWG paid for him to visit the veterinarian, who prescribed a special shampoo. Sampson's skin issues went away – and even better, he found his forever home!

#### Huckleberry, a 2-year-old Boxer mix,

loves to play and is a joy to have around. Unfortunately, when he wags his tail inside his shelter kennel, the tail hits the wall with such force that it eventually begins bleeding (the "happy tail" syndrome). DAWG bought a Tail Saver to protect his tail and give it time to heal. (Huckleberry was still available for adoption when this article was written.)



These are just a few of the animals helped by the Shelter Medical program.

In fiscal 2023, DAWG paid the medical expenses for 30 shelter dogs and 24 shelter cats.

With the help of our caring community of donors, many more deserving animals will get the medical support they need this year.

A while ago, a cat appeared on our patio that we had never seen before. This handsome orange tabby cat was starving to death. His ribs were showing, and he looked so sickly. We could tell he was a senior cat by his shaggy coat and the way he was walking with his arthritic bones.



We started feeding him, but he never seemed to get full. He must have been a pet at one time because he loved to cuddle and be held. I'm wheelchair bound and when I'd go out to check on him, he'd hop in my lap and take a nap.

Then, I noticed a mass on the side of his face that was quickly growing. He got to the point where he was just lying in the same spot moaning, so I brought him inside and called Tondra from DAWG to try to get him some help as I didn't have the financial resources to get him the help he desperately needed.

DAWG got him an emergency appointment the next morning at Carson Valley Veterinary hospital. Dr. Nick Mannon immediately took him into surgery after diagnosing him with a severe abscess.



He is now home and thriving, his days filled with rolling in the tanbark in the sun, cuddling in a lap, having his belly rubbed, getting his coat brushed and downing as many treats as possible. Without DAWG he would not have survived, and we wouldn't have this incredibly sweet cat filling our lives with so much joy. DAWG went above and beyond to give Chester his happily ever after in our home where he is absolutely adored. DAWG is an organization that makes such a difference in our community. Donations go a long way and help so many animals that would not have hope without them.

# DOG & CAT ADOPTION UPDATES



ASADA (now Bella) is a smart little girl. She doesn't like the snow. Our Lab goes out and Asada follows, runs down the steps, pees and then runs back. BLOSSOM (now Mila) is doing well, running around, playing, housetraining and all the usual puppy things. I have a 1-year-old and they play tug-o-war. BLUE (now Katrinka) is a very smart doggo!! We've discovered her love of nibbling at things she gathers off counters/tables and we are addressing those with more stimulating floor play with HER toys, quick neighborhood runs, and cuddles. We are so grateful to volunteer Jill for being the bridge to our latest adventures. BUBBLES (now Velma) is excellent. We have three girls ages 7, almost 6 and almost a year and she holds her own with them. BUSY For a little guy he is quite a jumper, two feet up into my truck, and quite independent. He barks when people are coming to the door before they even get there. He's a precious little guy and I am lucky to have him. CHARLIE (now Winston) has bonded with my husband and helps him pick up the apples in the yard. He sleeps in a crate from about 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. and he doesn't cry. CHILI is very playful. Our other dogs are still getting used to her, but they are older and crabby. Both kids play with her.



CORAL and NORA are both doing fine. They seem to be happy here and I am happy with them. DIAMOND (now Missy) has worked out perfectly. She took to us right away. DUKE (now Tucker) is great. Elliott sleeps on the bed and when he gets in my husband's lap, she moves to the other end of the couch. But they are getting along. 





I bought her a new bed and she ignored it and jumped up on my bed, so I put it away. She's a funny little girl with lots of personality and I couldn't be happier. She has a great home ... I promise. PROSPECT was readopted by his original owner and things are going well. QUESO (now Harvey) is pretty much fully potty trained, and he loves his crate. RINGO (now Nelson) is a wonderful little dog who gets along with everybody, and he feels right at home in a nice house with a couple of other dogs. We are so glad to have him. RUGER is the sweetest and really well-mannered. We have our two little royal pains, a Chihuahua and a Papillion. The older one went after him, and he ignored her. I work at home, so he stays in the office with me. He's actually for my 14-year-old grandson who plays with him off leash. SOPHIA is wonderful. She loves my cat and is good with my other dog. All the family dogs came to visit, and she was fine. She just fits right in. Seems like she's been here forever.

**ADOPTION UPDATE** 

We are happy to report that in November and December combined, DAWG facilitated the adoption of 33 dogs, 11 puppies, 6 cats and 57 kittens!

## YEAR IN REVIEW

The following information was presented to the County Commissioners by DAWG president Kathryn Dodge. DAWG's mission is to better the lives of Douglas County animals. This past year DAWG spent over \$200,000 and contributed more than 10,000 hours helping Douglas County animals. Specifically:

- DAWG Members spent 4,338 hours caring for the animals at the Douglas County Animal Services (DCAS) shelter.
- DAWG members provided care and assistance to 391 dogs and 300 cats that were adopted from DCAS. This included dog walking, providing care twice a day, cat care & socialization 365 days a year in all types of weather!
- DAWG Members spent 6,284 hours helping non-shelter animals and handling DAWG operations.
- DAWG co-hosted the 7th Annual Carson Valley Turkey Trot with the Cason Valley Foo d Closet. This event raised \$13,095 for each organization.

#### DAWG's financial expenditures for the animals of Douglas County included:

- Shelter Medical: \$50,238 in medical care for the animals that were at DCAS, including: wellness exams, dental work, senior exams, x-rays, surgeries, and post-adoption medical assistance.
- Community Assistance: \$42,309 assisting low-income Douglas County residents who needed help paying for their animals' veterinary care.
- Trap/Neuter/Return (TNR): \$21,732 to provide spay/neuter, vaccinations and minor medical for feral/community cats in Douglas County.
- Found Cat Program: \$21,562 to foster and provide necessary medical care to stray domestic cats/kittens pending admission or adoption through DCAS.
- Fix-a-Family Pet: \$16,564 helping low-income Douglas County residents spay and neuter their pets.
- Fix-a-Put Bull program: \$2,130 helping spay and neuter Douglas County Pit Bulls and Pit Bull mixes through our low cost "Fix-a Bull" program.
- \$5,840 to cover cat adoption fees and rabies vaccines.
- \$3,917 to incentivize Douglas County residents to adopt hard-to-adopt animals.
- \$3,551 for microchips for DCAS dogs and cats.
- \$2,081 to provide cat and dog food to Douglas Counties families in need (distributed by F.I.S.H. in the Ranchos).
- \$1,485 for post-adoption behavior training of DCAS dogs.
- \$600 to provide other assistance to DCAS including special food, cat litter, etc.
- \$492 to buy half the vaccines used to vaccinate the dogs and cats residing at DCAS.
- \$320 to assist Douglas County Veterans adopting animals from DCAS.
